
KEY MENU BUTTONS

- Ubuntu: "Show Apps" button








- Windows: Clicking on the "Start" button or tapping on the Windows key of the keyboard results in a "Start menu"




OVERALL MENU (continued)














KEY MENU BUTTONS

- Windows: Clicking on the "Task View" button or Windows key+Tab key results in a "Task View" screen that shows all desktops in use and all apps running in them
- Ubuntu: Clicking on the "Activities" button or tapping on the "Super" key (= "Windows key) of the keyboard results in an "Activities" screen that shows all desktops in use and all apps running in them
