REASONS TO RUN ANDROID APPS IN WINDOWS..

- Bundled Apps for the Best Surveillance Webcams Only Run in "Android" and "iOS"
- Running Android Apps in Windows.. Saves Money (= "Buy once-Install multiple times")

THREE WAYS TO RUN ANDROID APPS IN WINDOWS.. (continued)

- Android Emulators:
"Blue Stacks", "Nox", etc.
- "Phone Link" App in Windows 10/11
- "Amazon Appstore" (..Preview)

ANDROID EMULATORS FOR "WINDOWS.."

- "Emulator" is a software app that converts "Android" commands into "Windows.." commands:
When an "emulator" is in use, the "Windows.." operating systems "sees" "Android" apps as if they were "Windows.." apps.
- "Blue Stacks" is slower but uses less RAM and CPU cycles. Use it for older computers.
- "Nox" is faster and uses more RAM and CPU cycles. Use it for newer computers/

"PHONE LINK" APP IN WINDOWS 10/11

- Originally called "Your Phone Companion"
- Then you was called "Your Phone"
- Now it is called "Phone"
- Now it only works on Samsung cell phones and a few less-well know brand
- It originally worked but not well for "iPhones"
- When "Windows 11" was introduced, "iPhones" no longer worked with "Phone Link"

"AMAZON APPSTORE" IN "WINDOWS 11"

- It is now available in the "Microsoft Store" in "Windows 11 Pro" but it only is not available fo "Windows 11 Home"
- It is currently called "Amazon Appstore Preview"
- It is currently too "beta" for general use as a way to run "Android" apps in "Windows 11.."
- "Android" app developers will have to make big code revisions

"AMAZON APPSTORE" IN "WINDOWS 11" (continued)

- When you installed "Amazon Appstore Preview" into a "Windows 11 Pro", it automatically installs "Windows Subsystem for Android" and also activates the "Virtual Machine Platform" feature in "Turn Windows Features On and Off"
